TD 320'. DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

With the well standing cemented around 13" OD casing set @ 313', the well was allowed to remain undisturbed for a period of 36 hours. The cement plug was then drilled and the hole bailed dry. After bailing dry, operations were shut down for a period of one hour, after which the bailer was again run to determine if there was water present.

There was none present.

Drilling was resumed on the evening of October 30, 1939.
