We propose to acidize the subject well in two-stage treatment, 1500 and 3500 gallons, respectively. This well was completed October 15, 1944 at a total depth of 5152'. On an Initial Potential, flowed 288 BO in twenty-two hours natural on 28/64" choke. We believe that by acidizing, gas and oil production can be satisfactorily stimulated.
