1. The first group of authors (see Table 1) has been concerned with the effects of the type of stimulus on the response. The stimulus has been varied in terms of the number of stimuli, the duration of the stimulus, the intensity of the stimulus, and the type of stimulus. The response has been varied in terms of the number of responses, the duration of the response, the intensity of the response, and the type of response. The results of these studies have been mixed, with some studies showing a positive relationship between stimulus and response, and others showing no relationship.
