Gentlemen:

TEXACO Inc. respectfully requests administrative approval of an exception to New Mexico Oil Conservation Cornission Bule 107 (e) for State of New Mexico "T" (NCT-1) Well No. 2. This well is a proposed simple tubingless completion in the Vacuum (Clorieta) Pool, and is located 900 feet from the east line and 2000 feet from the north line of Section 25, T-17-S, R-34-E, Lea County, New Mexico.

The production string will consist of 2-7/8 inch casing set at approximately 6800 feet in a 7-5/8 inch hole. Completion will be through perforations from approximately 6060 feet to 6080 feet in the Clorieta formation. No corrosion or paraffin problems have been encountered in other wells completed in this zone and the subject well is expected to flow.

This zone has been approved by the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission as a tubingless completion in other simple completions in this area. An instance is TEXACO Inc. State of New Mexico "N" Well No. 7.

Attached is a diagrammatic shetch of the proposed tubingless completion and a plat showing the location of all wells on the State of New Nexico "T" (CCP-1) Lease and all offset wells along with the name and addresses of all offset operators. A copy of this request is being sent this date to all offset operators by registered rail.
