

7. METHODS OF HANDLING WASTE DISPOSAL

- A. Waste will be buried in reserve pits at a depth of 24". The well site will be cleaned of all waste and this will be done within 30 days after completion of the well.

8. ANCILLARY FACILITIES

- A. None required.

9. WELLSITE LAYOUT

- A. Exhibit C shows the relative location and dimensions of the well pad, reserve pits and major rig components.
- B. There will be no cut and fill. This area is relatively flat with sandy soil and sand dunes.
- C. The pad and pit area have been staked.

10. PLANS FOR RESTORATION OF THE SURFACE

- A. After finishing drilling and/or other completion operations, all equipment and other material not needed for further operations will be removed. Pits will be filled and the location cleaned of all trash and junk to leave the wellsite as pleasant in appearance as possible.
- B. If the proposed well is non-productive, all restoration and/or vegetation requirements of the Bureau of Land Management will be complied with and will be accomplished as quickly as possible. All pits will be filled and levelled within 90 days after abandonment.

11. OTHER INFORMATION

- A. The surface is federal surface.
- B. The topography consists of sandy soil with native grasses, catclaw, etc. No wildlife was observed, but the usual inhabitants of this region are jackrabbits, reptiles, coyotes, etc.
- C. There are no ponds, lakes, streams, or rivers in this area.
- D. There are no occupied dwellings or windmills in the area of the well-site.
- E. There is no evidence of any archaeological, historical or cultural sites in the area.
