DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

The cement set in the casing, top of which was 1198', The plug was drilled and the hole tested with 1200# Pressure, but the casing was ripped 24 times from 3710 to 3285' 90' Intervals, recovered circulation at 3285' and recemented with 800 Sax Cement, by the Halliburton Cementing process. Let stand for 72 hours and tested casing with 1200# pressure applied for 30 Min., drilled the plug and tested with 1200# Pressure applied for 30 Min, Both tests were Ok.
