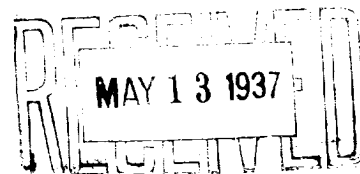

DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

3-5/8" 32# 8-Thd. New Seamless casing was set in this well at 2321' and cemented by the Halliburton Method with 600 sacks.

Casing and fittings were tested with 1200# pump pressure and allowed to stand undisturbed for thirty minutes. No drop in pressure resulted so the casing was then drilled out of the casing and the same test of 1200# pump pressure was again applied and allowed to stand undisturbed for thirty minutes. No drop in pressure resulted so the drilling was then resumed.
