7" 24# 10 thd. Seam. New Casing was set in this well at 3795' and cemented by the Halliburton Method with 100 sacks of cement.

Casing and fittings were tested by applying 1200# pressure and allowed to stand undisturbed for thirty minutes. The pressure did not drop. The cement was drilled out of casing and the same test was again applied and allowed to stand undisturbed for thirty minutes. The pressure did not drop.
