#### DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

**6-5/8" 24# New Electric welded casing was set in this well at 3810' and cemented by the Halliburton method with 100 sacks of cement.**

**Casing and fittings were tested with 1200# pump pressure and allowed to stand undisturbed for thirty minutes, No drop in pressure resulted. Cement plug was then drilled out of casing and the same test again applied, and left set for thirty minutes, No drop in pressure resulted so drilling was resumed.**
