INVESTIGATION OF THE ACTS OF VIOLENCE COMMITTED BY THE ORGANIZATION OF THE KLU KLUX KLAN, CHAPTER 10, CLARK COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, DURING THE YEARS 1944-1945.

REPORT OF THE UNITED STATES ATTORNEY, CLARK COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, SUBMITTED TO THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, WASHINGTON, D. C., JANUARY 1, 1946.

The following is a summary of the investigation conducted by the United States Attorney, Clark County, Mississippi, during the years 1944-1945, in connection with the acts of violence committed by the Organization of the Ku Klux Klan, Chapter 10, Clark County, Mississippi.

The investigation was conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Civil Rights Act of 1944, and the results thereof are set forth in this report.

The investigation revealed that the Organization of the Ku Klux Klan, Chapter 10, Clark County, Mississippi, was active during the years 1944-1945, and that it was engaged in acts of violence against the Negro population of the county.
