Dear Jir:

In planning casing and cementing program for our state 1-A, we find that in offset wells it has been found advantageous to save the gas found at various depths from 2800' to 3500' by letting it flow behind the oil string and inside the casing set below the selt and saving it with a bradenhead. This is found particularly helpful because there is little gas with the oil and the bradenhead gas can be used to start the wells flowing.

If we use the regulation 100 sacks of cement behind the oil string, which will be set at 3800' or a little above, the gas will be cemented off.

e request therefore to be allowed to use 75 sacks of coment or this strive of casing which will permit us to save part or all of the gas.
