DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

T. D. 3850 Line. Loaded annular space above packer set at 3754' with 161 bbls. oil & introduced 500 gal. Dowell XXF6 thru tubing. Flushed tubing with 25 bbls. oil. Swabbed 2-1/2 hrs. 2 1/2' from bottom, recovered oil flush & acid. Shut in 7 hrs. Opened well on 3/8" choke. Flowed 1 hr., no gauge & died. Shut in 2 hrs. & opened. Flowed 4 bbls. oil in 1 hr. & died. Left well small choke over night. 3-21-40 well open 24 hours on 1/4" choke. on 4 hour test during 24 hrs. flowed 9 bbls. oil cutting .2% emulsion. Gas daily 84 MCF. Gas-oil ratio 1626.
