Dear Mr. Sheldon:

The C-104 which you filed for your State SPX #1 in the Eumont Gas Pool is being held without approval until it is determined whether the well will continue to be classified as a gas well or reclassified as a oil well in the Eumont Gas pool. In the meantime we are issuing a supplement to the Oil Proration Schedule authorizing the production of a maximum of 1200 barrels of oil incidental to gas production for the month of November.

In order that we may have sufficient information to determine the proper classification of the above well we are requesting that you submit a Gas Oil Ratio test as soon as possible. If the Gas Oil Ratio exceeds 100,000 to 1 it will be classified as a gas well and if the Gas Oil Ratio is less than 100,000 to 1 it will be classified as a oil well in the Eumont Gas Pool and will be subjected to a 10,000 to 1 Gas Oil Ratio limit effective February 1, 1955.

The 0-100 which you filed for your State No. 11 in the amount of \$100,000 is being held without approval until it is determined whether the well will continue to be classified as a gas well or reclassified as an oil well in the amount of \$100,000. In the meantime we are issuing a permit to the Oil Production Schedule authorizing the production of a maximum of 1000 barrels of oil incidental to gas production for the month of November.

In order that we may have sufficient information to determine the proper classification of the above well we are requesting that you submit a Gas Oil Ratio test as soon as possible. If the Gas Oil Ratio exceeds 100,000 to 1 it will be classified as a gas well and if the Gas Oil Ratio is less than 100,000 to 1 it will be classified as an oil well in the amount of \$100,000 and will be subjected to a 10,000 barrel limit effective February 1, 1936.
