Oil Conservation Commission State of New Mexico Santa Fe, New Mexico

Gentlemen:

Gulf Oil Corporation respectfully requests that the Oil Conservation Commission grant an exception to No Flare Order R-553 as it pertains to Gulf's F. W. Kutter "E" Well No. 2 and in support thereof furnishes the following facts:

> The F. W. Kutter "E" Well No. 2 is located 1980' from the north line and 660' from the west line of Section 10, T-19-S, R-37-E, Lea County, New Mexico, and was completed on June 25, 1956, in the undesignated (Eumont) pool. The well on the initial test produced at the rate of 55 barrels of oil per day with a gas-oil ratio of 1,461 cubic feet per barrel. A September allowable of 39 barrels of oil per day is assigned to the well.

This well is presently located approximately li miles from the nearest low pressure gathering system; however, Warren Petroleum Corporation has advised that they have scheduled an extension of their low pressure gathering system to serve the general area in which the well is located and that a connection will be made in the next 30 to 60 days.

In view of the foregoing and to keep the well on production and thereby protect correlative rights, it is requested that the Oil Conservation Commission issue an exception to its No Flare Order R-553 with respect to a volume of approximately 65 MCF per day of low pressure casinghead gas which will be vented from Gulf's F. W. Kutter "E" Well No. 2, pending a connection by Warren.
