Gentlemen:

By this letter of application The Texas Company wishes to form a 160-acre non-standard gas proration unit in the Eumont Gas Pool of Lea County, New Mexico, under rule 5(b) of Order R-520, and to state the following:

(a) That The Texas Company proposes to drill its American-National-Keechane Unit Well No. 1, located in the NE/4 NW/4 Section 18, T-19-S, R-37-E, Lea County, New Mexico. This well is to produce from the Queen formation of the Eumont Gas Pool. The attached gas well plat, Exhibit "A", shows the proposed well and the proposed 160-acre non-standard gas proration unit. The proposed non-standard proration unit consists of the N/2 of the E/2 of Section 18, T-19-S, R-37-E. The attached exhibit shows the two other gas wells presently completed, or to be completed, in Section 18, in addition to the proposed unit.

(b) That the subject well will be completed in the Queen formation which is within the vertical limits of the Eumont Gas Pool, as designated by Order R-520. That under Rule 5(b) of Order R-520 this well will be drilled 660 feet from the two nearest property lines and 2200 feet from the next nearest property line and could have a maximum acreage of 320 acres assigned to it; however, we are requesting a unit of only 160 acres.

(c) That the non-standard gas proration unit will consist of four contiguous quarter quarter sections. That the non-standard proration unit will be wholly within a single governmental section. That the length or width of the non-standard proration unit will not exceed 2200 feet.

(d) That the present boundary of the Eumont Gas Pool includes the entire proposed 160-acre unit.

(e) That the entire non-standard proration unit may be reasonably presumed to be productive of gas. That the proposed unit is surrounded by other gas wells in the Eumont Gas Pool which are as follows:

This well is to produce from the Queen formation of the Rumont Gas Pool. The attached gas well plat, Exhibit "A", shows the proposed well and the proposed 160-acre non-standard gas protection unit. The proposed non-standard protection unit consists of the W 1/2 of Section 18, T-19-S, R-37-E. The attached exhibit shows the two other gas wells presently completed, or to be completed, in Section 18, in addition to the proposed unit.

(b) That the subject well will be completed in the Queen formation which is within the vertical limits of the Rumont Gas Pool, as designated by Order R-520. That under rule 5(d) of Order R-520 this well will be drilled 660 feet from the two nearest property lines and 3200 feet from the next nearest property line and could have a maximum acreage of 320 acres assigned to it; however, we are requesting a unit of only 160 acres.

(c) That the non-standard gas protection unit will consist of four contiguous quarter quarter sections. That the non-standard protection unit will be wholly within a single governmental section. That the length or width of the non-standard protection unit will not exceed 3280 feet.

(d) That the present boundary of the Rumont Gas Pool includes the entire proposed 160-acre unit.

(e) That the entire non-standard protection unit may be reasonably presumed to be productive of gas. That the proposed unit is surrounded by other gas wells in the Rumont Gas Pool which are as follows:
