DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

12 1/2" 40# 8-Thd. New Lap Weld casing was set in this well at 200' and cemented by the Halliburton Method with 200 sacks.

Cement was drilled out of the casing and the hole was bailed dry and allowed to stand undisturbed for one hour. The bailer was then run to bottom again to determine if any water had accumulated. No water had accumulated so the drilling was then resumed.
