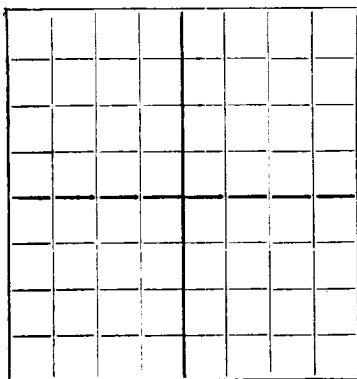

THE HISTORY OF THE
CITY OF BOSTON

FROM THE FIRST SETTLEMENT
TO THE PRESENT TIME

The city of Boston, situated on a neck of land between the harbor and the bay, was first settled by a small number of Englishmen in 1630. These settlers, who were known as the Puritans, came to the city in search of religious freedom and a place where they could practice their faith without interference from the Church of England.
