We wish to call your attention to Sinclair Oil & Gas Company's Bertha J. Barber Well #7 located 990' FW and 1650' FN line west half of Northwest quarter, Section 8, Township 20 South, Range 37 East, Eunice-Monument Field, Lea County, New Mexico.

The following are some of the pertinent data and present condition of this well:

Casing:	7" OD casing set at 3208' w/1000 sacks.
Tubing:	2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " UE set at 3836'. ✓
Packer:	Set at 3842' w/Baroid mud containing cottonseed hulls and Fibrotex pumped on top of packer.
Completion date:	6-1-37.
First oil produced:	First 12 hrs. produced 150 barrels.

WORKOVER:

November 29 - December 1, 1938 - Moving in and rigging up rotary tools.

December 2, 1939 - Completed rigging up, mixing mud preparing to kill well.

December 3, 1939 - Pumping in mud and water to kill well.

December 4, 1939 - Killed well, working on tubing trying to work loose to pull.

December 5, 1938 - Still trying to work tubing loose, unable to pull.

December 6, 1938 - Trying to un-screw tubing. Unable to unscrew.

December 7, 1938 - Put control quipment and heads back on well and swabbed well in.
