DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

The 3" tubing in this well corroded through above the packer set in the well and we were unable to pull the 3" tubing and packer. Ran a 1-1/2" x 3" Robinson hookwall packer on 1-1/2" tubing in well and after unsuccessful attempt to set packer at 4058/61, it was finally set at 4056' inside of the 3" tubing in the well, and a water shut-off was obtained.

Before repairing well, it was making its allowable and approximately 50% water with a gas-oil ratio of 4910/1. After working well over, tested 61.27 bbls. in 24 hours, no water, thru 10/64" choke with gas-oil ratio of 1985/1.
