RE: WALKER OIL CORP. BOND

Dear Dr. Wells:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter together with copies of letters from the E. M. Woodard Investment Company of Wichita, Kansas. Your letter dated June 10th. Mr. Harry Walker was in earlier that week asking about the possibilities of reducing their bond.

They have the two wells in the south end of the Hobbs field, which were cemented from the bottom to the top. Each string of pipe was cemented with sufficient cement to reach up to the next string of pipe above. On wells cemented this way there will be very little to do when the time comes to abandon them.

My suggestion is this: Have the Walker Oil Corporation make a company bond to take the place of their surety bond with the United States F. & G. Co. With the property they have in the state I feel we would have sufficient protection.

This morning, I received a letter from DULANEY, JOHNSTON, YANKEY & PRIEST, of Wichita, Kansas asking about this bond. I am advising them that I am at this time taking this matter up with you and you will advise them. If the above suggestion meets with your approval, please mail the Walker Oil Corp the proper bond form to be executed and returned.
