## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE ACT

Section 551 of the Administrative Procedure Act defines the scope of the Act. It applies to all agencies of the executive branch of the federal government, except for those specifically exempted. The Act covers the process of rulemaking, adjudication, and the issuance of orders. It sets forth the procedures that agencies must follow when they engage in these activities, including the requirement of notice and opportunity for public participation in rulemaking.

Section 552 of the Administrative Procedure Act, known as the Freedom of Information Act, provides for the disclosure of records held by federal agencies. It sets forth the procedures for requesting and receiving information, and it lists the categories of information that are exempt from disclosure.

Section 553 of the Administrative Procedure Act sets forth the requirements for rulemaking. It requires that agencies publish a notice of proposed rulemaking in the Federal Register, and it provides for the opportunity for public comment on the proposed rule. The Act also sets forth the procedures for the finalization of a rule, including the requirement of a concise statement of basis and purpose.

## APPENDIX

It includes the full text of sections 551 through 553, and it also includes the text of the Freedom of Information Act, as amended. The appendix is organized into sections, and each section is numbered to correspond to the section number in the Act.
