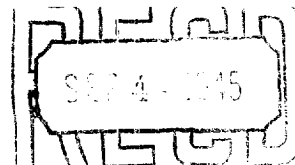

This well was completed in July of 1936 at total depth of 3850'. For the past six months it has been making 20% water and will not flow all of the time. We propose to kill well and plug back to 3844' with sand and then set Dowell plastic plug from 3844' to approximately 3825'. We expect to do this work about August 29.
