Gentlemen:

Phillips Petroleum Company kindly requests approval in accordance with Rule No. 112-A of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission to dually complete its Hobbs Well No. 4, located 660' from the south line and 1980' from the west line of the SW/4 of Section 18, Township 20S, Range 37E, Lea County, New Mexico.

Our Hobbs Well No. 4 is located in the Monument Field and is currently producing from the Grayburg-San Andres formation through open hole from 3737' to 3865'. This well was originally completed on July 5, 1939. The oil string consisting of 7" OD casing is set at 3737'. Top of the Queen sand is at 3290'. Top of the Penrose sand (Main Eumont sand zone) is at 3390'. We propose perforating the Penrose sand from 3390' to 3490' and thereby dually completing the well in the Eumont Gas Zone and the Grayburg Oil Zone as shown on the attached diagramatic sketch.

Our Hobbs lease described as the SW/4 of Section 18-20S-37E contains a total of 160 acres. On completion of this well as a gas producer we propose forming a 160 acre gas proration unit.
