Smith; 121 jts. 23# J-55; 7 jts 23# S-80 A.O. Smith; 1 jt. 26# N-80. Total tallies 7822', H-12', set at 7834'. Cemented with 575 sax 2% Howcogel and 125 sax common Portland bulk cement. Plug at 7788'. Job started at 1.30 PM and completed at 9.50 PM.

I propose to drill plug and test shut-off at 9.50 PM Nov. 20, 1949.
