Additional information:

This well was drilled to the total depth of 3760'. Swabbed in and made an estimated 2,000,000' gas and a prox 1 barrel oil per hour. Set Robinson rubber packer at 3689' w/ perforations below. Swabbed dry. Acidized w/ 2000 gallons of Halliburton acid. Acid started in under 1400# on casing and 1000# on tubing. Finished under 900# on casing and 800# on tubing. Flushed tubing w/ 22 barrels of water. Acid set 20 minutes. Swabbed 3 times and well started flowing. Flowed 182 barrels oil on 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ hour test. Hourly average of 11-3/4 barrels. Daily gas volume of 150,000'. Gas oil ratio of 769. Flowing thru 1" open choke on 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " tubing. Tbg.P. 20#. Csg.P.
