REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE PROFESSIONAL STATUS OF THE NURSE

The American Medical Association has long been interested in the professional status of the nurse. In 1906, the Committee on the Professional Status of the Nurse was organized, and since that time it has been actively engaged in a study of the subject. The committee has held numerous conferences with representatives of the nursing profession, and has also conducted extensive research into the various problems connected with the nursing profession. The following report is the result of this study.

THE NURSE'S PROFESSIONAL STATUS

The nurse is a professional person, and as such, she should be recognized as such by the public and by the law. The nursing profession is a distinct and separate profession, and it should be treated as such.

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
