Gentlemen:

Humble Oil & Refining Company respectfully requests administrative approval of a two-well gas proration unit for its F. F. Hardison "B" Lease. The Unit consists of 160 acres, being NE/4 of Section 34, Township 21 South, Range 37 East of Lea County, New Mexico.

Well No. 1 was dually completed in the Drinkard Oil Pool and Tubb Gas Pool in December, 1954, as authorized by Order No. DC-99 of April 6, 1954. This well is located 1990 feet from the North line and 440 feet from the East line of Section 34. This well was incapable of producing the 160 acre unit allowable and was classified as Marginal in August, 1957. Well No. 2, located 660 feet from the North line and 610 feet from the East line, has been dually recompleted in the Drinkard Pool and the Tubb Gas Pool as authorized by Order No. DC-493 of August 18, 1957. It is requested that approval be given to produce the 160 acre unit allowable from either or both of these wells within the unit.

We support our application with the following statements:

1. The proposed unit complies with the requirements of the Special Rules and Regulations for the Tubb Gas Pool of Order No. R-586.
2. The unit consists of 160 acres lying wholly within a single governmental section.
3. The unit consists of contiguous quarter-quarter sections.
4. The length or width of the proration unit does not exceed 2640 feet.
5. The entire gas proration unit may reasonably be presumed to be productive.
6. All operators owning interests within 1500 feet of the well are being notified by registered mail by copy of this application.
7. We have attached a gas proration unit plat which dedicates 160 acres to the two wells.

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
A plat is attached hereto showing to the best of our knowledge and belief the proposed unit, the location of the wells, the offset ownership and Revised Form C-128 on both wells.

I hereby certify that the information given above is true and complete to the best of my knowledge.



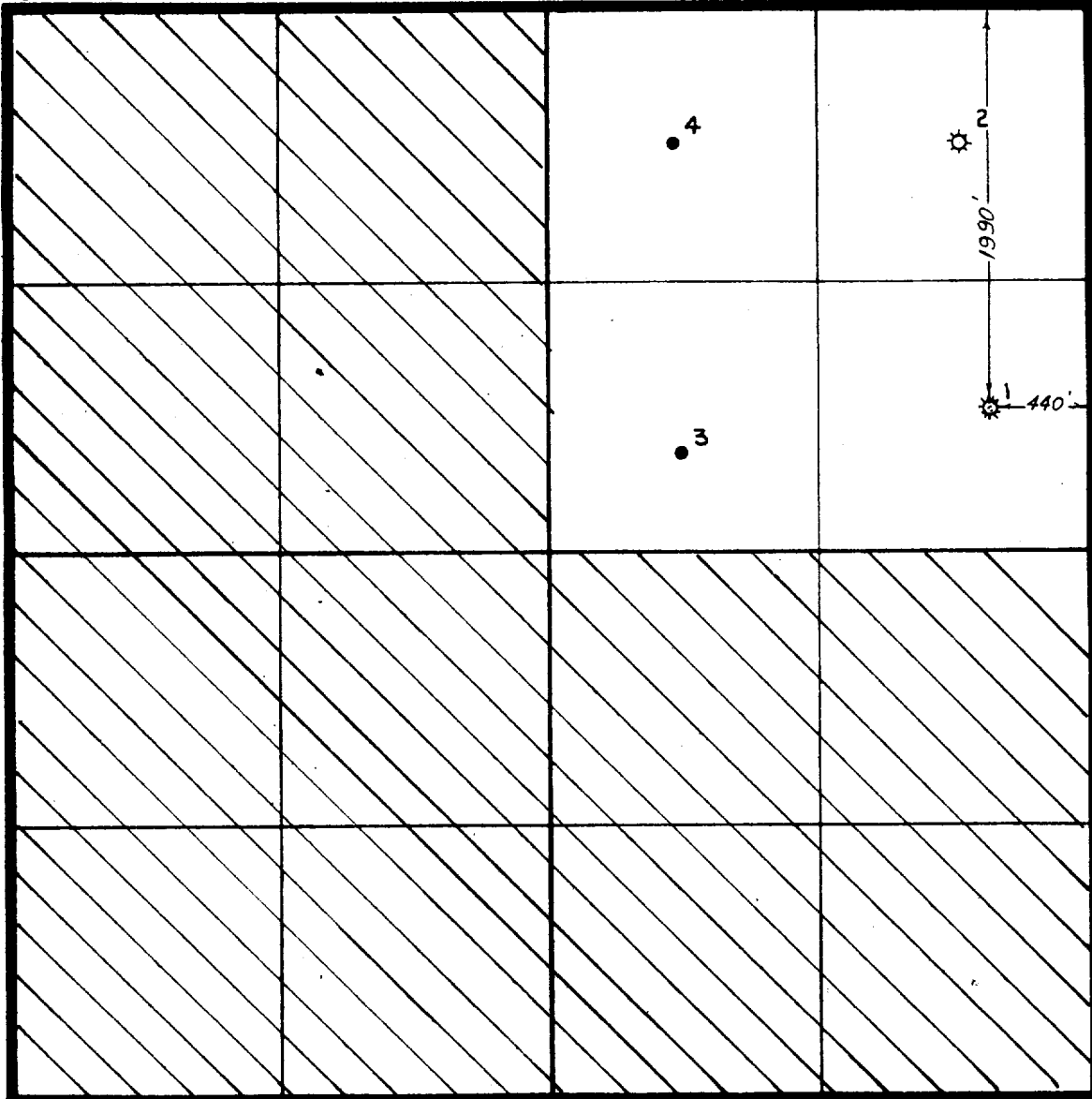
