In accordance with NMOCC Order No. MC-1400, it is proposed to perforate, treat and triple complete the Lockhart A-35 No. 3 in the Tubb gas, Drinkard oil and Blinbry oil zones. The well is presently a Tubb gas & Drinkard oil dual.

Procedure: Perforate Blinbry intervals 5710, 5715, 5719, 5733, 5741, 5767, 5784, 5798, 5808, 5846 and 5867 w/1 JSFF; acidize w/2,000 gallons acid and fracture treat using 20,000 gallons lease crude.

Instructions

General: This form is designed for submitting proposals to perform certain well operations, and reports of such operations when completed, as indicated, on Federal and Indian lands pursuant to applicable Federal law and regulations, and, if approved or accepted by any State, on all lands in such State, pursuant to applicable State law and regulations.
