DETAILS OF WORK

It is our intention to drill a well at the above location to a total depth of approximately 6200' with rotary tools in an attempt to obtain commercial production in the Minebry. All casing points will be cemented in accordance with approved methods of the U. S. Geological Survey and any other special requirements will be complied with.

It is planned to use the following casing pattern: 13 3/8" casing to be set at 225' and cemented with approximately 250 sacks, cement to be circulated; 9 5/8" casing to be set at approximately 3150' and cemented with 1,675 sacks cement, or sufficient cement to protect the sand section as determined by survey; 7" casing to be set at total depth and cemented with 1,150 sacks cement, or as determined by survey, and to be perforated opposite the pay zone.

Approval to produce this well upon completion is also requested.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.
