of section 22, N-28-E, R-28-E in the Jalint Pool, Leo County, New Mexico.



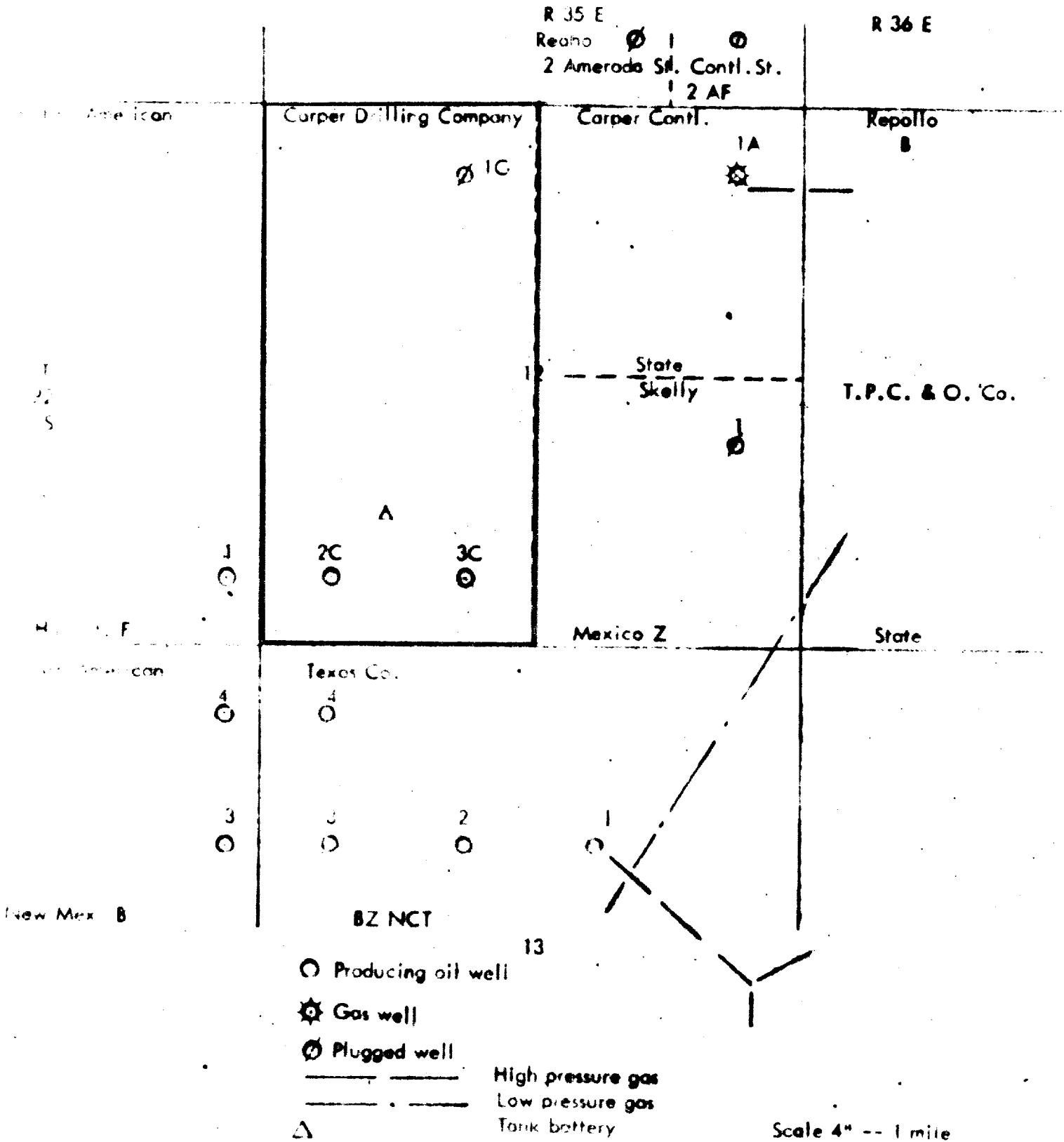
