FULL DETAILS OF PROPOSED PLAN OF WORK

FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS IN THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COMMISSION

Well was drilled to total depth of 4500', no oil or gas formations were encountered. We propose to plug the well as follows:

The hole will be filled to approximately 4100' with 10# mud, bridged and a cement plug of 15 Sax dumped on top of the bridge (Base of salt 4080'). Then the hole will be filled to approximately 1905' with mud, bridged and another cement plug of 15 Sax dumped on the bridge. The intermediate casing strings will be pulled and the hole filled to the top with mud, and a plug of 10 sax cement run in the top of the 16" surface casing. The 16" casing was set at 82' with 75 sax cement. A regulation marker will be placed at the hole.
