

Definitions used by NMAS

As used by NMAS, a "site" is defined as any concentration of cultural material containing clear evidence of other than en passant human occupation. Sites are generally larger than 16 square meters and contain at least one localized concentration with an artifact density higher than one artifact per square meter. Cultural remains must include more than one type of artifact exclusive of burned stone. Manifestations separated by a hiatus of 20 m or more between concentrations are assigned separate site designations while those within 20 m of each other are subsumed within a single site.

An "isolated manifestation" or "occupation zone" is any artifact or concentration of cultural material separated by more than 20 m from any other manifestation. Isolated manifestations are generally smaller than 16 square meters and have concentrations of less than one artifact per square meter exclusive of burned stone. An isolated manifestation can be attributed to en passant activities.
