I expect to use this well for a producing well or a disposal well before plugging it. It is 2 miles East of a very active area where production is being found in a number of Delaware and Bone spring zones. We have some shows behind pipe not tested. I hope to find out which zones should really be tested based on the new development.

And there is a need for a disposal well here too. I am not really ready to give it up to disposal yet.

It has high strength "deep well" casing that we tested to 5000 psi when we worked on it. I can't imagine any mechanical or reservoir problem from leaving it another year.

It would be pretty expensive, and perhaps wasteful, to plug off the existing perforations which had a show of oil. We wanted to delay the decision and the frac job to see how this zone performs in the wells to the East.

I respectfully request you consider this request.
