Saltwater**

Pogo Producing Company, P.O. Box 10340, Midland, Texas; 79702-7340 (Contact - Richard L. Wright at 915/682-6822) has applied to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division for Administrative Approval for Authorization to inject saltwater into its Diamond "34" State #1 Well, located 990' FSL & 1650' FWL of Section 34, T-22-S, R-33-E, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico. The purpose of such well will be to dispose of saltwater produced from Pogo's nearby wells. The injection interval will be in the Delaware (Bell Canyon and Upper Cherry Canyon) formation between 5,100'-6,516' beneath the surface, with an expected maximum injection rate of approximately 3,000 BOWPB with an expected maximum injection pressure of approximately 1020 psi. Any interested parties must file objections or requests for a hearing with the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division, 2040 South Pacheco, Santa Fe, New Mexico 87505 within fifteen (15) days from the date of Pogo's Application.
