**OIL & GAS INSPECTOR**

The first part of the report deals with the general situation of the country and the position of the various groups. It is found that the country is in a state of general confusion and that the various groups are in a state of mutual hostility. The second part of the report deals with the specific details of the situation and the measures that have been taken to deal with it. It is found that the measures taken have been inadequate and that further action is required.

### The position of the various groups

The position of the various groups is as follows: The first group is the Government, which is in a state of general confusion. The second group is the military, which is in a state of mutual hostility. The third group is the civil population, which is in a state of general confusion. The fourth group is the foreign powers, which are in a state of mutual hostility.

The measures that have been taken to deal with the situation are as follows: The first measure is the establishment of a committee of inquiry. The second measure is the appointment of a special commissioner. The third measure is the establishment of a special court. The fourth measure is the appointment of a special judge.

The results of the measures taken are as follows: The first result is that the committee of inquiry has been established. The second result is that the special commissioner has been appointed. The third result is that the special court has been established. The fourth result is that the special judge has been appointed.

The conclusion of the report is that the situation is still in a state of general confusion and that further action is required.
