DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

Well caving so badly was not producing much oil and little gas. Could not clean out. Bridged constantly. Ran bow survey which showed losses at 3517' and below to 3590'. Got tight bridge 3620' up to 3581'. Did squeeze job (Halliburton) with Baker packer set in casing 3510'. Four stage job 200 sack first, 150 second, 150 third, 100 fourth- total 600 sack cement when pressured up to 3400 lbs. Cleaned out to bottom 3762'- No caving- No gas- some oil. put on pump Feb. 4, 1944. Looks now as though operation successful but patient died.
