FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS IN THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COMMISSION

We ran, on July 4, 1945, 7" OD 20# new condition casing to a depth of 1906', and cemented same with 50 sacks of cement. The plug was stopped at 9:00 AM July 4th at a depth of 1885'. The cementing was done by the Halliburton Co. Rotary tools will be torn out and cable tools rigged up. The cement plug will then be drilled and a water shut-off test made.
