A check of the file on your Ralph A Shugart #2 shows that we have received no forms on this well in some time, although we have in our file a letter from you dated November 11, 1954, which stated that you intended to leave this well open until a later date. Please file with the Commission Form C-103, giving us the status of this well, and showing whether or not it is a permanent plugging or a temporary plugging.
