Dear Sir:-

In reply to your letter of September 10, 1935 regarding the amount of cement used on our Orcutt #1 at Eunice; the 15 sacks used is calculated to fill 194 feet between 5-1/2" casing and the 6-3/4" open hole. While drilling through this particular zone there was no loss of circulating fluid so there should be no doubt that the cement filled as high as calculated.

This is the first well drilled on that lease and it was our intention to obtain permission to save bradenhead gas. Through error the request was not made. We now request permission to leave the well in its present condition in order that we may have bradenhead gas for lease and development purposes.
