HE: RO-332 - State Lease, Lea County, N. M.

We have recently acidized our #1 well on the R. Olsen State Lease, Lea County, New Mexico. We used 4000 gallons of acid, allowing it to remain in the well for 10 hours.

After cleaning itself, the well produced 60 barrels of oil the first hour through a 3/4 inch choke, and is now making its daily allowable through approximately a 1/16 inch choke with from 800 to 1000 lb. tubing pressure, and 1100 lb. casing pressure.

Our reason for acidizing #1 well is due to the fact that the well had quit flowing steady and flowed only by heads, resulting in a waste of gas and continuous attention in order to properly produce the well. We feel that the acidizing has def-initely improved the well. If there is any further information which you desire, we will be glad to furnish you with same.
