DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

April 3, 1940 Loaded hole with oil, spotted 175 gals, Jelly Seal on bottom, flushed tubing with 15 barrels oil then raised tubing 110' or to 3806'. Pumped in 1,500 gals. Dowell formation plug followed by 100 gals. Aquagel mixed with Dowell J-4 Seal Material. Bled off 16 3/4 barrels oil while formation plug was being injected, casing valve then closed and plugging material pushed into formation. .

April 10, 1940 acidized with 500 gallons Dowell 15% Acid.

Production before:- Gas oil ratio was 14,741 cu. ft. per bbl at allowable rate of flow or state gas oil ratio test.

Production after:- Flowed 98 bbls oil & 4 bbls water in 24 hrs thru 1/2" choke 1 1/2 turns ope
