DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

Drilled plug and cement and in testing hole bailed from 4 to 5 bailers of water per hour. Recemented bottom of hole with 25 sack of cement forcing same back in formation with 1200# pump pressure and let stand 48 hours and drilled cement and found complete shut-off. After approval of Mr. J. D. Hunter, State Oil and Gas Inspector, preparations were made to drill ahead.
