MISCELLANEOUS REPORTS ON WELLS

The following reports were received from the several counties of the State, and are hereby published for the information of the public. The reports are in the form of questions and answers, and are intended to show the results of the investigations made by the several county engineers, and the action of the several county boards of health, in relation to the wells in their respective counties. The reports are arranged in alphabetical order of the counties, and are as follows:

ALBANY COUNTY. The Albany County Board of Health, in its report, states that the wells in this county are generally of the shallow type, and are not subject to the same contamination as the wells in the other counties.
