Gentlemen:

The Humble Oil & Refining Company hereby petitions the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission for administrative approval of a non-standard 280-acre gas unit lying wholly within the horizontal limits of the Eumont Gas Pool, Lea County, New Mexico and in support thereof does state:

1. By prior action, the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission has approved a gas unit of 160 acres comprising the SW/4 Section 10, Township 21 South, Range 36 East, Eumont Gas Pool, Lea County, New Mexico. Under date of July 17, 1953, Request for Gas Allowable was made for A. J. Adkins well number 4. This well is located 660 feet from the west line and 1980 feet from the south line of Section 10, Township 21 South, Range 36 East. By plugging back this well had been recompleted from an oil well producing from the Grayburg formation in the Eunice Pool to a gas well producing from the Queen formation in the Eumont Gas Pool.
2. By this application, Humble Oil & Refining Company petitions the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission to increase the size of the above described gas unit from 160 acres to 280 acres by the addition of S/2 NW/4 and the NW/4 NW/4 Section 10, Township 21 South, Range 36 East.
3. The proposed non-standard gas proration unit consists of contiguous quarter-quarter sections.
4. The proposed non-standard gas proration unit lies wholly within a single Governmental section.
5. The entire proposed non-standard gas proration unit may reasonably be presumed to be productive of gas.
6. The length or width of the proposed non-standard gas proration unit does not exceed 5,280 feet.
7. The Humble Oil & Refining Company owns the entire working interest in the proposed non-standard gas proration unit.
