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MISCELLANEOUS REPORTS ON WRECKS

1. This report is a summary of the information received from the oil companies and other sources on the wreck of the oil tanker "M. J. Moran" on the coast of the State of California. It contains a description of the vessel, the circumstances of the wreck, and the results of the investigation. The vessel was owned by the Moran Oil Company and was carrying a cargo of oil. The wreck occurred on the night of October 15, 1911, and the vessel was completely destroyed. The cause of the wreck was determined to be a collision with a rocky shoal.
