Re: Continental Oil Company Application for an Enlargement of a 160-acre to a 200-acre non-standard gas proration unit for its State D-11 No. 1 in Section 11-21S-36E, NMPM, Eumont Gas Pool, Lea County, New Mexico

Gentlemen:

Continental Oil Company respectfully requests administrative approval under the provisions of Rule 5(b) of the Special Rules and Regulations for the Eumont Gas Pool of Order No. R-368 for the formation of a 200-acre non-standard gas proration unit consisting of the SW/4 and SW/4 NW/4 of Section 11, T-21S, R-36E, for its State D-11 No. 1 well located 1980 feet from the Jouth line and 660 feet from the West line of Section 11, T-21S, R-30E, Iea County, New Mexico, in the Eumont Gas Pool.

The 200-acre non-standard gas proration unit as applied for is an enlargement of a 160-acre non-standard gas proration unit presently assigned to the State D-11 No. 1 well under Order No. R-520, August 12, 1954, as amended. The 40-acre addition to the present unit consisting of the SW/4 NW/4 of said Section 11, is owned in equal undivided 1/2 interests by Atlantic Refining Company and Catron et al. Continental Oil Company will be operator of the proposed 200-acre non-standard gas proration unit as set forth in the Operating Agreement for the State D-11 Eumont Gas Pool Unit No. 1 dated February 1, 1959, and approved by the Commissioner of Public Lands, State of New Mexico, on June 25, 1959.

In support of this request, we should like to point out that the proposed unit conforms with the requirements of said Rule 5(b) in all respects as follows:

1. Said proposed non-standard gas proration unit consists of continuous quarter-quarter sections. New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission Page 2

2. Said proposed non-standard gas proration unit lies wholly within a single governmental section.

3. The entire proposed non-standard gas proration unit may be reasonably presumed to be productive of gas.

4. The length or width of said unit does not exceed 5,280 feet.

5. Copies of this application have been furnished this date by registered mail to all offset operators and all operators within 1,500 feet of said well, as required by the provisions of said Rule 5(b).

A plat is attached hereto showing to the best of our knowledge and belief the present unit, the proposed enlarged unit, the location of the No. 1 well and other wells on the lease, offset wells and ownership thereof.

The granting of this application is in the interest of preventing waste and the protection of correlative rights.

In view of the facts set out herein, it is respectfully requested that the Commission enter an order approving the nonstandard gas provation unit for Continental Cil Company's State D-ll No. 1 well as described above.
