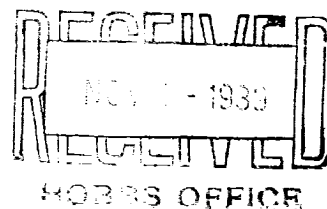

PROHIBITION AGAINST THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

Section 1, Act of October 3, 1917

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That any person who manufactures, sells, transports, or in any manner distributes any alcoholic beverage in violation of the provisions of the Act of October 3, 1917, shall be fined not more than \$10,000, or imprisoned not more than five years, or both, at the discretion of the court; and any person who aids or abets in such violation shall be fined not more than \$5,000, or imprisoned not more than two years, or both, at the discretion of the court.

Approved: October 3, 1917. Woodrow Wilson, President.
