NOTICE OF INTENTION TO TEST WATER SHUT-OFF

Notice must be given to the State Geologist or to the proper Oil and Gas Inspector at least five days before the test. It is desirable that a representative of the Department of the State Geologist witness the water shut-off before drilling into the productive sand whenever possible. If changes in the proposed plan are considered advisable, a copy of this notice showing such changes will be returned to sender. Submit this notice in triplicate.

THE NATIONAL ACADEMY OF SCIENCES

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE NATIONAL ACADEMY OF SCIENCES

The Committee on the National Academy of Sciences was organized in 1962 to study the structure and functions of the National Academy of Sciences and to make recommendations for its improvement. The Committee has held numerous public hearings and has received many suggestions from scientists, educators, and the general public. The following are the major findings and recommendations of the Committee:

1. The National Academy of Sciences should be reorganized to improve its effectiveness in carrying out its mission. This should be done by creating a new governing body, the National Academy of Sciences Council, which would be responsible for the overall management of the Academy. The Council would be composed of representatives from the various scientific disciplines and would be elected by the members of the Academy.
2. The National Academy of Sciences should be given a more active role in the selection of members. This should be done by creating a new body, the National Academy of Sciences Council on Membership, which would be responsible for recommending members to the Council. The Council on Membership would be composed of representatives from the various scientific disciplines and would be elected by the members of the Academy.
3. The National Academy of Sciences should be given a more active role in the selection of the President of the United States. This should be done by creating a new body, the National Academy of Sciences Council on Presidential Selection, which would be responsible for recommending the President to the Council. The Council on Presidential Selection would be composed of representatives from the various scientific disciplines and would be elected by the members of the Academy.
4. The National Academy of Sciences should be given a more active role in the selection of the Vice President of the United States. This should be done by creating a new body, the National Academy of Sciences Council on Vice Presidential Selection, which would be responsible for recommending the Vice President to the Council. The Council on Vice Presidential Selection would be composed of representatives from the various scientific disciplines and would be elected by the members of the Academy.
5. The National Academy of Sciences should be given a more active role in the selection of the Chief Justice of the United States. This should be done by creating a new body, the National Academy of Sciences Council on Chief Justice Selection, which would be responsible for recommending the Chief Justice to the Council. The Council on Chief Justice Selection would be composed of representatives from the various scientific disciplines and would be elected by the members of the Academy.
6. The National Academy of Sciences should be given a more active role in the selection of the Justices of the United States Supreme Court. This should be done by creating a new body, the National Academy of Sciences Council on Supreme Court Selection, which would be responsible for recommending the Justices to the Council. The Council on Supreme Court Selection would be composed of representatives from the various scientific disciplines and would be elected by the members of the Academy.
7. The National Academy of Sciences should be given a more active role in the selection of the members of the United States Supreme Court. This should be done by creating a new body, the National Academy of Sciences Council on Supreme Court Membership, which would be responsible for recommending members to the Council. The Council on Supreme Court Membership would be composed of representatives from the various scientific disciplines and would be elected by the members of the Academy.
8. The National Academy of Sciences should be given a more active role in the selection of the members of the United States Supreme Court. This should be done by creating a new body, the National Academy of Sciences Council on Supreme Court Membership, which would be responsible for recommending members to the Council. The Council on Supreme Court Membership would be composed of representatives from the various scientific disciplines and would be elected by the members of the Academy.
