Dear Mr. Macey:

Reference is made to Commission Order No. R-734, which increased the non-standard proration unit for The Texas Company J. K. Rector #4, Jalmat pool, from 40 acres to 120 acres. The order was dated December 14, 1955 and in compliance with our request the operator has filed a revised plat outlining the 120 acre unit. It was our opinion that the allowable for this unit should have been increased on the January proration schedule, but a check of the work sheets indicates that it has not been increased. The operator is very anxious that the increase become effective on January 1st and if this is in order, kindly advise and I will issue the necessary supplement to the January schedule. The Commission was organized on January 1, 1910, and has since that time been engaged in a study of the conservation of the natural resources of the State. It has held numerous public hearings and has received many suggestions from the people of the State. It has also conducted extensive investigations into the various problems connected with the conservation of the natural resources of the State. The results of these investigations are set forth in this report. The Commission believes that the conservation of the natural resources of the State is a matter of the highest importance, and that it is the duty of the State to take effective measures to protect these resources. It believes that the best way to do this is by the establishment of a system of public lands, and that this system should be managed in such a way as to secure the greatest benefit to the people of the State. The Commission believes that the establishment of such a system is essential to the future of the State, and that it is the duty of the State to take prompt action to establish it.
