 After letting cement set for 48 hours ran test for casing shut off as follows:  
 Found cement in casing at 3099', applied 1050# to casing let set for 30  
 minutes, pressure dropped to 975#. Drilled plug, cement and 6" into formation.  
 Applied 950# to casing, let set for 30 minutes, final pressure 900#.

Drilling was resumed.
